CHOICE PROGRAM:

The features of the Hampton School program listed below allow for very specific attention to the individual needs of students.

- Small multi-grade classrooms exist in grades 1-2 and 3-4 for all major subjects where two co-teachers work using a variety of instructional methods.
- Multi-grade classes for some specific grades exist in grades 4-5, 6-7 again using two teachers at all times.
- There is a daily enrichment period where students are involved in activities that are designed to practice employability skills.
- Special scheduling allows all students to take Language Arts and Reading at the same time and nearly all students to take Math at the same time thus allowing for grade acceleration for gifted students.
- There is a daily homework club run by staff members that can assist a student with homework or provide additional academic assistance.
- The school has affordable Before and Aftercare programs and a very affordable pre-school.
- There are two certified teachers in every academic class for every subject at all times.
- Even the multi-graded classes are small in size as grade level enrollment demonstrates:
